This biography of Alaska's Mount McKinley presents a complete history of one of the world's great mountains. Author and famed mountaineer Fred Beckey starts with McKinley's associations with Denali to the influx of Russian fur traders and American prospectors. The mountaineering history of McKinley follows, with a look at the gold seekers and surveyors who were among the first to map the region. Beckey examines the efforts of those who raced to be first on McKinley's summit and details the first complete ascent by Hudson Stuck and his party. Summit attempts, including those of the author himself. Also included is information about the challenges and logistics of climbing Mount McKinley, with information on planning, permits, suggested routes, and what to expect. Personal anecdotes and previously unpublished photographs make this volume a must-have for historians and climbers everywhere. This guidance provides advice on how unused or intermittently used chimneys can be made more energy efficient by preventing draughts. Open chimneys and flues can be useful sources of ventilation but they can often let too much warm air out and cold air in. The resultant draughts can create uncomfortable conditions. Chimneys in older buildings can develop a variety of defects over time. It is important to check chimneys regularly to avoid introducing further defects when measures are taken to improve energy efficiency but it does not cover the diagnosis or remedy of common defects. Chimneys are often prominent and significant parts of historic buildings and fireplaces are frequently striking and significant elements of the interior. Many chimneys were constructed in single skin brickwork and specialist advice sought, before adapting or altering a chimney. Fireplaces and chimneys are often still in use, some for open fires, some for room heating stoves, and some for central heating and hot water boilers. Many other fireplaces and chimneys are no longer needed and have been blocked up, temporarily or permanently. Whether used or unused, fireplaces and chimneys are an important part of the energy efficiency of a building. This guidance forms one of a series of thirteen guidance notes covering the thermal upgrading of building elements such as roofs, walls and floors.

Not illustrated. 1851 edition. Excerpt: ... A FEW POPULAR STOVE PLANTS AND THEIR CULTURE. Achtmenes.--Few plants have so rapidly acquired a large portion of favour as this striking family. The roots are small and tuberous, as much like large white maggots as any thing I can think of, and A. coccinea had been cultivated many years under the name of Trevirania coccinea. The plant, it will be recollected, died down every season. The maggot-like tubers were taken up when nearly dry, and generally placed, half a dozen in a pot of the size thirty-two, and, after growing some months, bloomed a small scarlet flower at the base of each leaf: bright as it was, it never was a favourite with me, because the proportion of flower to the foliage was so small; but we have now some splendid varieties with flowers as large as a half-crown piece, and as numerous as the little scarlet ones were. The plants grow finer and are literally covered with bloom, --some of dark purple, others of a rosy purple. A. Longiflora, A. Skinneri, and A. Picta, should be grown. The others I care little about; in fact, all the small flowering ones may be dispensed with, and especially as we are acquiring new varieties of the larger kind every season. They grow best in loam and peat, and, if the loam be from rotted turfs, no dung; if it be plain, put one part loam, one part leaf mould, and two parts peat. Fill the thirty-two-sized pots within an inch and a half of the top, first settling it down by striking the pot on the table; then place about half a dozen of the largest tubers in the soil, and cover them up nearly to the top of the pot. Let this be done in January or February, and place them in the stove anywhere. "When they come up they must be placed in the light--the nearer the better. Refresh them occasionally with...
